The walker sculpture

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A bronze figure almost 1.90 m tall, with the silhouette of a hiker, welcomes those who arrive in Los Canarios along the Volcano Route. The Town Council placed it where the GR 131 trail passes through the village, next to the church of San Antonio Abad, and unveiled it on 17 January 2015, the day of the municipality's patron saint.

The plaque says it in two languages: dedicated to all the walkers who day after day travel through our village admiring its beauty. It is a tribute to the hikers who cross Fuencaliente on the GR 131, the trail that traverses the island along its ridge and ends at the lighthouse, and to those who run the Transvulcania every year, which also passes through here.

It stands at the starting point of the municipal routes from Plaza Minerva and is part of the municipality's Sculpture Route.

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
