Las Indias Viewpoint

The Mirador de Las Indias viewpoint is on the LP-2, just past the village of La Fajana, above the districts of Las Indias and La Fajana. From its balcony a panorama of the south of La Palma opens up: the south-west coast, the banana plantations of La Costa, the island of El Hierro on the horizon and sunsets that are its best moment of the day.

It was reopened after renovation on 7 August 2026 as something more than a balcony over the landscape: the Town Council added a *décima* poem by Miguel Martín Méndez, a verse improviser born in Las Indias who lives in Tenerife, and a sculpture by the Fuencaliente artist Gustavo Díaz, to bring together nature, art and literature in a single space. It is one of the stops on the *Décima Route* and on the *Sculpture Route*.

It has a gravel esplanade with picnic tables under the trees, children's games and a wooden railing overlooking the sea. It is reached by car along the LP-2, with parking beside the road, and on foot along municipal Route 2, which passes through La Fajana on

its way to La Zamora. See also: Barrio Las Indias and Barrio La Fajana.
